VCH History of Barbon now online

Summer is usually a quiet time for the VCH project, as many of us head off on our holidays. It was therefore a very pleasant surprise on my return to find the final modifications had been made by Emmeline Garnett to her article on Barbon township. Emmeline is one of the project's most stalwart volunteers, having already produced draft histories for Kirkby Lonsdale and Casterton. Her next article will be on Middleton, which means that significant progress is being made in Lonsdale Ward.



St Bartholomew's Church, Barbon

For those not familiar with Barbon, it is a small rural township in the ancient parish of Kirkby Lonsdale. The manor was held by the Lasceles family from the thirteenth to fifteenth centuries. By 1588 it had come to Sir Richard Shuttleworth (d.1599) and has remained in the Shuttleworth family to the present day. A schoolmaster was recorded in the township as early as 1578. Machell commented that the young man who taught there in 1692 had travelled to the Holy Land and come back with both arms tattooed. Over the past few months, Eric Apperley has been providing links through the CCHT website of photographs of listed buildings on the English Heritage Images of England website. This includes all surviving buildings built before 1700. as well as bridges, sculptures and war memorials. So far Eric has completed all the wards in Cumberland, as well as East ward in Westmorland. This makes a grand total of 3676 images, covering 221 townships!
