Cummersdale	1861 - Increase in population attributed to the erection of a cotton mill. Many cottages have been built to house employees. 1901 - Part of Carlisle Rural District 1931 - Part of Border Rural District 1981 - 582 persons usually resident 1991 - 521 persons usually resident
Cumwhinton	1801-31 - Combined figure for Cumwhinton and Conthill. 1871 - No separate figure; population of whole parish recorded from now on.
Dalston	1821 - New collieries have produced an increase of population. 1841 - The decrease of population is ascribed to the depressed state of the manufacturing districts. 1861 - Decrease of population throughout the Sub-District of Dalston [i.e. Dalston Parish, & Orton & Cummersdale], except in the township of Cummersdale, is attributed to the destruction, by fire, of a cotton mill, and to the depressed state of hand-loom weaving 1871 - Figure for whole parish only from now on. 1951 - In 1934, Dalston CP was enlarged by gaining some land (1513 acres) from Castle Sowerby CP, but some land (2014 acres) was transferred from Dalston to Skelton CP. 1981 - 2261 persons usually resident 1991 - 2358 persons usually resident

Raughton and Gaitsgi	1821 - new collieries have produced an increase of population in the parish 1861 - The decrease of population throughout the parish is attributed to the destruction by fire of a cotton mill and to the depressed state of hand-loom weaving. 1871 - No separate figure; population of whole parish recorded from now on.
Rockcliffe	1861 - Decrease in population in the Church Town Quarter is mainly attributed to the pulling down of dilapidated cottages 1871 - Combined figure for the Parish 1871 - The decrease in population is attributed to the demolition of cottages and the amalgamation of several small farms. 1981 - 743 persons usually resident 1991 - 799 persons usually resident
Scotby	1871 - No separate figure; population of whole parish recorded from now on.
Sebergham	1861 - Combined figure for Sebergham Castle and Sebergham Church. 1951 - Sebergham re-formed from part of Sebergham and part of Castle Sowerby CPs in 1934. 1971 - Some land (6 acres) in Sebergham CP was transferred to Caldbeck CP. 1981 - 335 persons usually resident 1991 - 325 persons usually resident
Stainton	1871 - Disappears from records as an individual parish. Subsumed into Stanwix, District 2, and, in later years, District 4.

Thursby (High & Low)	1811 - Separate figures for Thursby High (127) and Thursby Low (145) 1871 - No separate figure; population of whole parish recorded from now on.
Upperby	1871 - No separate figure; population of whole parish recorded from now on.
Wampool	1871 - No separate figure; population of whole parish recorded from now on.
Warwick	1871 - Figure for whole parish only from now on. 1951 - In 1934, Warwick CP was abolished to enlarge Wetheral CP.
Waverton	1981 - 329 persons usually resident 1991 - 356 persons usually resident
Wetheral	1871 - Figure for whole parish only from now on. 1951 - Wetheral CP enlarged by incorporation of Warwick CP in 1934. 1981 - 4447 persons usually resident 1991 - 5042 persons usually resident
Wiggonby	1871 - No separate figure; population of whole parish recorded from now on.
Wigton	1821 - The increased population is attributed to increased trade. 1841 - The return for the Township of Wigton includes 88 persons in the Wigton Union Workhouse. 1851 - The return for Wigton Township includes 132 in the Wigton Union Workhouse 1891 - Combined figure for Wigton with Woodside 1981 - 4772 persons usually resident 1991 - 5306 persons usually resident. Boundary change due to the Allderdale Parishes Order of 1982.
Woodside Quarter	1891 - Figure combined with Wigton 1951 - Woodside CP re-formed in 1934 from Woodside and Oulton. 1981 - 869 persons usually resident 1991 - 540 persons usually resident. Boundary change due to the Allderdale Parishes Order of 1982.
Wreay	1951 - The population totals for Wreay and the other constituents of the Civil Parish of St Cuthbert Without are not recorded from 1951 onwards.
