Possibly not all of Stainmore's eligible population was counted (e.g. no Ubank or Buckle names). This may be from absence at war or displacement due to war and plague, or that part of the Stainmore return is missing. Even assuming the figures are complete the disruptive times probably depress the population totals.

Though Beresfords figures for Helbeck are at variance, they could be fuller figures and include more Stainmore and Netherbrough. These await further study and have been limited in total to 84 (without adding column 5).

To adjust for the absence of the non tax-paying elderly and children a multiplier range of between 1.5 and 2 might be suggested (based on estimates available for the 17th century).-

This would suggest a range for the parish of between 386 to 654 persons. Estimating the Stainmore share as about 42% this would propose a figure of between 162 and 275 for the township giving a median of about 218.
